Norfolk Safeguarding Adults Board (NSAB): Eyes and Ears Needed

A serious problem that exists already and is likely to get worse as lockdown unwinds is the problem of 'adult abuse'. This can be defined as

'the physical, emotional, sexual, psychological and financial abuse of adults who have care and support needs. It can also include neglect, domestic violence, modern slavery, organisational or discriminatory abuse.'

Safeguarding is preventing that abuse and acting quickly when abuse is suspected.

The Norfolk Safeguarding Adults Board (NSAB) has launched a campaign against adult abuse with the slogan "**See Something, Hear Something, Say Something**". There is a special number to ring **0344 800 8020** if you are worried about an adult being abused or at risk of abuse.
